

This submission responds to the Commission's letter of February 20, 2009 regarding the committee's 2008 Post-General Report:

- 1) Receipts on Line 15 from Alaskans for Begich, Committe to Elect Alan Grayson, Darcy Burner for Congress, Hagan Senate Committee, Jeanne Shaheen for Senate, Jeff Merkley for Oregon, Jim Himes for Congress, Markey for Congress, Martin for Senate, Murtha for Congress Committee, Perriello for Congress and Udall for Colorado were reimbursements for credit card processing charges incurred during bundled contributions from internet fundraising on behalf of these candidates.
 - 2) The -\$15,000 disbursement to 80/20 Consulting reflects the partial reassignment of a disbursement to this company disclosed on September 18, 2008 on Line 21b to Independent Expenditures.
 - 3) Expenses for Catering were ordinary operating expenses and not on behalf of any federal candidate.
 - 4) Expenses for GOTV Consulting, List Management Services, List Purchase, Media Consulting, Media Production, Pictures, Postage and Printing disclosed on Schedule B were not allocable to any federal candidate.
 - 5) With respect to a payment to Google on 10/20/08, this was an overage from web ads that were prviously disclosed as estibmates but due to high clickthrough volumes, the costs for the ads exceeded the original estimates. The payment to Hotjob.com for webads was inadvertently omitted from Form 24 filings.
- All payments dislosed on Schedule E for 10/17/08, were placed on a Form 24 and prepared for filing with the FEC. The committee had believed that this 24 hour report had been filed utilizing the Commission's FECFILE software and did not realize there was a problem with this filing until the receipt of the Commission's letter regarding this matter. The committee has provided the Commission a copy of its .dcf file to demonstrate that a closed Form 24 was prepared for uploading on 10/17/08. The committee will takes steps to ensure that it confirms that submissions for Form 24 were successfully received by the Commission in the future.
